What is National Service Programme of Trinidad and Tobago? NSP-TT

The National Service Programme of Trinidad and Tobago (NSP-TT) is a pioneering initiative by the Ministry of Youth Development and National Service (MYDNS), under the guidance of the Honourable Minister Foster Cummings. This initiative promotes youth development, civic participation, and a sense of national pride. NSP-TT is structured to offer opportunities to gain marketable skills. enhance personal and social well-being, and exemplify responsible citizenship. Participants may either be registered members of an authorised national service programme or volunteers, contributing to the betterment of their community and country.

Overview of NSP-TT

The NSP-TT initiative was officially launched on July 30, 2024, at the Southern Academy for the Performing Arts (SAPA) in San Fernando. The programme design was overseen by a dedicated 12-member Advisory Committee, established in October 2021, which included experts from various fields committed to the development and implementation of this transformative programme.
